Gospel Reflection

Three Hummock Island

The sons of Zebedee expected Jesus to lead a Messianic revolt to throw off the yoke of imperial Rome. But they wanted to be part of a similar sort of power structure. They had not grasped that Jesus had come to turn that sort of society upside down.

However, over the centuries, the Church took on much of the trappings of power of imperial Rome. The popes governed much of Italy. Giuseppe Garibaldi was one of those generals who defeated the forces defending the Papal States, and in doing so actually liberated the papacy from its role as feudal overlord of much of Italy.

In the course of the campaign, when despondent, Garibaldi often reflected on the delightful time he spent on Three Hummock Island just off the coast of Tasmania. So we may say that the liberation of the papacy, enabling it to respond more clearly to today's Gospel, began in Tasmania!

Pope Francis embodies the spirit of today's Gospel. He rails against a Church exhibiting 'the leprosy of a feudal court'. Rather, he has said: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.' And in his actions he has shown himself as a true 'Servant of the servants of God' as Jesus commands in today's Gospel.

We may pause for a moment to pray for Pope Francis that he may have the strength and time to persevere in his responding to today's Gospel so that the papacy may be truly liberated so as to practise a radically different way of exercising leadership in the Church and for the world.

COVID UPDATE

- * Our churches are still closed and there will be no public masses until the 80% vaccination threshold is reached.
- * Churches may be opened for weddings and funerals, and for services restricted to those who are fully vaccinated. Whenever people gather in a place of worship, the **number permitted is according to the 4 sqm rule, and masks must be worn. Covid Check-in is also required** via the Service NSW App or a written record.
- * If all those present are vaccinated, the permitted number for weddings and funerals will be 100
- * If some of those attending a funeral or wedding are not vaccinated, then the ceremony must be "small" : maximum 5 at a wedding and 10 at a funeral.

Update for Volunteers from the Safeguarding Office of the Archdiocese

Following our recent audit by the Safeguarding Office, we have been advised about a few changes to the list of volunteers who require a Working With Children Check (WWCC). The Safeguarding Office has made these changes after consultation with the Office of the Children's Guardian.

Volunteers who **MUST** have a WWCC are Sacramental Coordinators, Sacramental Group Leaders, Catechists, Children's Liturgy Coordinators, Children's Choir Ministry Leaders, Acolytes and Senior Altar Servers, Readers, Eucharistic Ministers and Wardens/Collectors. Volunteers in these roles who do not have a WWCC or those whose WWCC have expired cannot be engaged in child related work.

Those volunteers who **no longer require** a WWCC are Cleaners, Choir members, Musicians, Piety Stall, Flower arrangers, Hospitality, Welcomers, Altar Linen, Legion of Mary. We thank everyone for their cooperation in going through the process of obtaining a WWCC and hopefully this updated information is helpful.

Volunteers who have a WWCC need to renew it before expiry date and you should receive an email reminder from the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian. Some of you will have received an email notifying you of an extension to the expiry date due to the pandemic. Could you please notify us via email once you have renewed your WWCC. It is also a requirement of the Safeguarding Office that all volunteers who are required to have a WWCC also need to complete Safeguarding Induction Training. This training can be done online and is very quick and simple. The link for the training is: https://forms.gle/9ebT3voEAtfP7P8R9

In order to register for training, you will need to provide an email address. Volunteers who work in Sydney Catholic Schools will need to use their personal email address and not their work email to do this online training. Once you have completed the training, you will receive a Certificate to verify training is complete. If anyone is worried about completing this training online, we will offer a training session in the near future. Please let us know if you would prefer this.

Call for urgent assistance to counter expected Euthanasia Bill

Dear friends,

As you may already know, Archbishop Anthony Fisher is encouraging us to actively oppose the expected tabling of a Euthanasia Bill by Alex Greenwich MP:

"Sadly we expect a bill to be tabled in the NSW Parliament this Thursday, allowing for euthanasia in our state. These terrible laws will target our most vulnerable and we know that in every jurisdiction where these laws have been passed, they are expanded to those who are not terminally ill, to also cover the chronically ill, disabled or even with mental health problems, to children and to others."
